

ACADEMICS SCHOOL CALENDAR

Scheme of Studies, Evaluation & Promotion Rule:

The school follows the scheme of studies provided by Central Board of Secondary Education. The examination from Academic year 2023-2024 and onwards would be conducted as per remodeled assessment structure explained below:

Scholastic Area: IX & X

No Semester system: Annual examination will take place at the end of the session covering the complete syllabus for classes.

- 1. Scholastic Area:
- (i) Students will be graded in 8 point grading scale as followed by the board.
- (ii) Annual examination will be conducted of 80 marks and internal assessment 20 marks.
- (iii) Student has to secure 40% marks out of 80 marks in each subject.
- (iv) Internal assessment comprises of Periodic tests (10 marks), notebook maintenance (5 marks), subject enrichment activity (5 marks) and subject need to secure 33%. Out of overall 20 marks are marked in each subject.

Internal Assessment:

- A) Periodic tests will be conducted thrice a year including the portion cumulatively.
- B) I and III Periodic tests will be conducted out of 50 marks and II periodic test will be conducted out of 80 marks. Average of the best two out of 10 will be added in the internal assessment.
- C) Internal assessments will be completed as follows:

- D) Notebook maintenance can be assessed before the end of each term based on the following parameters. (5-Marks)
- a) Regularity (b) Assignment Completion (c) Neatness and Upkeep of Notebook
- E) Subject Enrichment Activities: will comprise of techniques like ASL/ Reading/ Dictation/ Debate/ Public Speaking etc. for languages, Lab activities/ Projects/ Map work/ Model making/field trips etc which needs to be conducted thrice a year. (5 -Marks)
- F) The assessment of 6th& 7th additional subject (class 9th to 10th only) will be assessed as follows:
- 1. Computer Applications (165)=Theory Examination of 30 marks and practical of 70 marks.
- 2. Health care (413) =Theory Examination of 50 marks and practical of 50 marks.
- Re-examination will not be conducted in any case.

1. Scholastic Area: The assessment structure and Examination for classes III to VIII comprises of two terms i.e. Term-1 and Term-2 as per given structure.

2. Subject Enrichment Activities: There will subject specific activities aimed at enhancing the understanding and skills of the students. These activities are to be carried out throughout the term; however they will be evaluated at the term end.

- 3. Co-Scholastic Activities (Classes III-VIII): For the holistic development of the student, co-curricular activities will be graded term wise on a 3-point grading scale (A=Outstanding, B= Very Good and C=Fair). The aspect of regularity, sincere participation, output and teamwork will be the generic criteria for grading in the following co-scholastic activities:
 - a) Work Education- Work Education refers to skill-based activities resulting in goods and services useful to the community.
 - b) Art Education (Computer, Visual and Performing Art)
 - c) Health and Physical Education (Sports/Martial Arts/Yoga/NCC etc).

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4. Discipline (III to VIII) The students will also be assessed for the discipline which will be based on the factors like attendance, sincerity, behavior values, tidiness, respectfulness for rules and regulations, attitude towards society, nation and others. Grading on discipline will be done term wise on a 3-point grading scale (A=Outstanding, B= Very Good and C=Fair). Weightage: in Std. I & II there will be 2 terms. Each term will have one periodic test and one term examination. One term course will not be carried to next term. In std. III to X in all subjects the previous term course will also be included.

Promotional Rules:

- 1. A student will be promoted to next higher class if he/she fulfills the following criteria:
 - (a) Attendance: A minimum of 75% attendance during the academic session is mandatory. Attendance will be counted from the beginning of the session.
 - (b) For Std. I to VIII, Students who obtained grade 'E' and above in all the subjects separately in aggregate will be promoted to the next higher class.
 - (c) For Std. IX & X, Students who are not able to get grade 'D' or above in aggregate in one or more subject shall not be permitted admission in higher class.
- 2. Co-Scholastic Area:
 - (a) Co-scholastic activities will be assessed on a 5 point grading (A-E) scale by the concerned teacher framing effective tools for the same.
 - (b) Grading will not have any descriptive indicators and students will not be upgraded on basis of the co-scholastic grades.
 - (c) Co-scholastic area will cover Work Education/Pre Vocational Educational/Art Education/Heath and Physical Education.
- 3. Students will be graded by the class teachers for discipline in a 5 point grading scale considering the attendance sincerity, behavior and values.
- 4. There will be no change in the scheme of studies for students of Std. XI & XII. The assessment will be done though Unit Tests, term Examination and Pre-Board Examination.
