1. Subject Enrichment Activities:

Map or the project work may be undertaken as suggested by the NCERT syllabus and textbooks.

CO-SCHOLASTIC ACTIVITIES (Classes I – X):

For the holistic development of the student, co-curricular activities in the following areas be carried out by the teachers and will be graded term-wise on a 3-point grading scale (A=Outstanding, B=Very Good and C=Fair). The aspect of regularity, sincere participation, output as teamwork be the generic criteria for grading in the following co-scholastic activities.

• A) Work Education:

Work education refers to skill-based activities resulting in goods or services useful to the community.

• B) Art Education:

(Visual & Performing Art)

• C) Health & Physical Education: (Sports/Material Arts/Yoga/NCC etc.)

DISCIPLINE:

(Class I - X):

The student will also be assessed for the discipline, which will be based on the factors like attendance, sincerity, behaviour, values, tidiness, respectfulness for rules and regulations, attitude towards society, nation and other. Grading on discipline will be done term-wise on a 3-point grading scale.

(A=Outstanding, B=Very Good and C=Fair)

RULES FOR PROMOTION:

- 1. Promotion is made based on the grades obtained in the Annual Assessments. Minimum qualifying grade in scholastic is **D** or (33% marks) in all subjects and 40% in aggregate.
- 2. A student must have at least **75% of attendance**.
